Dr. Sean Murphy currently serves as Assistant Professor of Arts Management & Entrepreneurship at Baldwin Wallace University, as well as founding area coordinator of Music Industry studies. He was instrumental in Baldwin Wallace University's naming to *Billboard Magazine's* list of Top Music Business Schools for 2020, as well as facilitating guest speakers, partner projects, and internship opportunities for students in this degree area.

Additionally, Sean is the founder of Murphy Music Press publishing, celebrated for its "intentional diversity and inclusivity" by the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP) Board of Directors member and composer Alex Shapiro. Working with many leading composers of the wind band idiom, Murphy Music Press was the print distributor for all three winning works of the composition contests held by the National Band Association, The American Bandmasters Association, and the College Band Directors National Association awarded at the 2019 Midwest International Band and Orchestra Clinic.

As a saxophonist, Sean is a Selmer-Paris performing artist, whose performances have been described as "truly beautiful" by Jamie Bernstein. His debut album, *Rediscovering Bauzin*, was "warmly recommended" by *Fanfare Magazine*, and his articles on saxophone performance, pedagogy, and entrepreneurship have been published in both domestic and international journals.
