New Forms...Again!

Many of the forms which were updated by the state and are needed for Festival and Fest Events are now available online. Forms that can be found on the D1 site under the FORMS tab include:

- Medical Information & First Aid/Emergency Treatment Authorization Form (which now have cell phone number additions and Epi-Pen use)
- Medical Administration Record Form, which must be submitted for each medication, and which also now includes changes regarding dispensing EVEN if the student is 18 years of age or older (*ALL medication must be administered by the festival nurse, regardless of the student's age or Section 504 or Transition Plan)
- Special Dietary Needs Form
- Instrument Responsibility Form

Please make sure that you are using the most current versions of our festival forms for the 2015-16 school year, particularly in the case of students advancing from district to region to state. If the forms are not consistent, they will need to be resubmitted when advancing on so that all participants are in compliance.





Advocacy and You

Hello! My name is Emily Wardle and I am your District 1 Music Education Advocacy Representative who is also on the Advancement of Music Education Council. As a state organization, PMEA actively advocates for music and arts education at the local, state, and federal level. PMEA advocates through the <u>organizational leadership</u> as well as the <u>Advancement of</u>

<u>Music Education Council (AME)</u>. Advocacy Reps and leadership in PMEA actively engage in advocacy and policy work, and most of the public policy work occurs at the state level.

As your District Rep, it is my job to ensure that D1's advocacy needs are met. I share helpful advice, ideas, and resources with each music educator in the District. Even if there is not an advocacy "emergency" at your school, you are a music advocate by way of your daily activities. Advocacy is about being PROactive, not REactive, and my goal is to help you gather tools in your toolbox to be PROactive about your program, students, and your livelihood. Emailed advocacy updates will occasionally come to you from myself, Mark Despotakis (our AME Council chairperson), and the state, and please read those emails carefully and in a timely fashion.

I have a bimonthly newsletter called "Conducting Advocacy" that will be published electronically within the next month. Keep your eyes peeled for it! Adjudication News

PMEA ADJUDICATION LAUNCHES NEW 'FESTIVAL' OPTION FOR 2016!

Band, orchestra and choral directors at all levels will have a new performance context available in 2016 to participate in a Music Performance Assessment (MPA) through PMEA Adjudication. In addition to the existing 'Traditional' format, directors will now be able to choose to participate in a 'Festival' performance context. A 'menu' of options will be available for each director to customize an adjudication experience that best meets the needs of his or her program at that time.

The Festival performance context will include the following options for each ensemble:

- 1. To perform pieces of any grade level. Directors would be able to choose among any pieces they are already preparing in class. Directors would not be required to choose music from the PMEA Selective Music List or provide the grade levels of the pieces being performed.
- 2. For bands and orchestras, participating in the Sight-Reading component would be optional. If Sight-Reading is selected, the director would choose the grade level of the music involved that he/she feels would be the most appropriate for that ensemble. If Sight-Reading is not selected, the director could choose a clinic with the adjudicator assigned to sight-reading if desired.
- 3. For choral ensembles, we plan to develop a new Sight-Reading component that would be optional in either 'Traditional' or 'Festival' performance contexts.
- 4. To receive Scores and Ratings by the three adjudicators using the PMEA Assessment Form.
- 5. To receive Adjudicator Comments through digital audio commentary in real time and/or as written on the Assessment Form.

Ensembles choosing the 'Festival' performance context would receive an official PMEA Certificate recognizing participation. The certificate would include the rating, if requested, reflected by the director's choice of terminology, either the longstanding 'Superior, Excellent..... etc.', or 'Outstanding, Advanced, Proficient....etc.', similar to that of the PSSA's. The Registration Fee for ensembles participating in the new 'Festival' performance context would be lower than those participating in 'Traditional' by an amount reflecting the difference in the cost of the plaque as received by those ensembles.

We hope that directors at any level who have not yet participated in PMEA Adjudication would be more comfortable and interested in participating within the array of options available within the 'Festival' context. Some directors may now choose to participate in the 'Traditional' context with their high school or top ensemble and then also bring their second or middle/junior high school ensembles to participate in the 'Festival' context.

Districts 1 and 5 have been statewide leaders in hosting for many years, with MPA's planned for 2016 at Upper St. Clair HS, Norwin HS, Kiski Area HS, Canon-MacMillan HS, Beaver HS and Westminster College.

New Community Announcements Page

The E-Mail Alerts that members of District 1 previously were able to subscribe to for community announcements have not been regularly maintained for a few years. The board voted to reestablish the Membership Chair position and as part of this will also create a membership committee who will be charged with strengthening communication and ties with the members in all 5 counties.

Until all of that is set in motion and running, a page has been created under the Members tab for members to share announcements such as job openings, auditions for community groups, notification of special programs that would be interesting to PMEA members, etc. Once the membership committee organizes their methods of communication, the e-mail alert system will be reinstated so that members can subscribe to specific types of announcements (elementary, middle school, high school, college, general music, strings, band, choir, technology, etc.).

To submit something to be included on the announcements page, click the "submit announcement" button to complete the form with information to be shared with the membership. After approval from the EXCOM, the website editor will post it on the Community Announcements page under the Members tab.

Honors Jazz Festival

Auditions: November 24, 2015

Festival: December 18-19, 2015 at Duquesne University

Improvisation –

All students will improvise for a minimum of two choruses over the Jamey Aebersold Vol. 2 "Nothing But the Blues", Track 5 Fast Bb Blues

Lead Trumpet - The following should be prepared in addition to the "Jazz Conception" etude

- Hayburner from the Basie-Nestico Lead Trumpet Book published by Kendor Music
- Begin 5 measures before letter G and end at letter I

Etudes – All instrumentalists will play the following etude from the Jim Snidero "Jazz Conception" book

- Alto, Tenor and Bari Sax; Trumpet and Trombones Two Plus Two (bass trombone should use the bass trombone book)
- Piano and Vibes Two Plus Two (from the regular book; NOT THE COMPING BOOK)
 Written part for Intro and Chorus 1 and comp for chord changes provided for Chorus 2
- Guitar Two Plus Two
 - Written part for Intro and Chorus 1 and comp for chord changes provided for Chorus 2
- Bass Two Plus Two (from the "Bass Lines" book)
 - Written bass line for Intro and Chorus 1 and improvise a bass line for chord changes provided for Chorus 2
- Drums Two Plus Two

Written out drum part for Intro and Chorus 1 and the lead sheet for Chorus 2 (treat Chorus 2 as if it is a big band chart; setting up figures and playing fills as the music dictates) Demonstrate styles including but not limited to the following:

Swing, Samba, Mambo, Bossa Nova, Salsa, Cha-Cha, Afro-Cuban, Funk

Trade fours repeatedly (four bars of time and fours bars of solo fills) with any of the previously mentioned Jazz styles
